Taliban declares war against Daesh

Taliban declared full-scale war against
the Islamic State. Spokesman for the
militant group, Zabihullah Mujahid,
said the Taliban fighters would fight
Daesh (also known as Islamic State in
the Global North) in the country. "Our
fighters [Taliban] are committed and
ready to eliminate Daesh from
Afghanistan. We will fight them
[Daesh] in cooperation of Afghan
nation," he said.

India lodges protest with Pakistan envoy against 'cross-border terrorism' DAWN|9<sup>th</sup> August A day after Balochistan Home Minister

A day after Balochistan Home Minister accused Indian spy agency Research and Analysis Wing of masterminding the suicide attack at Quetta Civil Hospital, India summoned Pakistan High Commissioner in New Delhi Abdul Basit to lodge a protest against "continuing cross-border terrorism from Pakistan". India's Ministry of External Affairs spokesman Vikas Swarup said Foreign Secretary S Jaishankar summoned the Pakistan envoy and specifically mentioned " a Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorist and Pakistani national Bahadur Ali, who was apprehended recently" in India-held Kashmir (IHK).

### ISIS Khurasan chief reportedly killed in East of Afghanistan

The leader of the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) terrorist group for the so called Khurasan province has been killed during an operation of Afghanistan. The Ministry of Defense of Afghanistan officials have said they are aware of the reports regarding the death of ISIS Khurasan chief Hafiz Saeed but an investigation is underway to

confirm his death. This is not the first time reports have emerged regarding the death of Hafiz Saeed in eastern Afghanistan.

# Pakistani minister claims there is no ban on country's currency in Afghanistan

# Construction of two Bangladesh warships begins in China

# India seeks easy repatriation of profits by its cos in Bangladesh

### UN calls to Maldives to refrain from employing the death sentence

United Nations called to the Maldives to stick to a decades-long moratorium on imposing the death penalty. High Commissioner for Human Rights for the United Nations in Geneva, Switzerland, Prince Zeid Ra'ad al-Hussein issued a statement today saying that three men are already at risk of being executed. He raised concerns by saying that it is "deeply regrettable that a series of steps have been taken to resume executions in the country" despite the efforts to end the use of the death penalty in the Maldives.

# 4 government lawmakers vote against Defamation Bill

Four government lawmakers – including South Kulhudhuffushi MP Mohamed Nasheed – voted against the bill on defamation and freedom of expression which was passed by the People's Majlis on Tuesday afternoon. Three lawmakers from Progressive Party of Maldives (PPM) voted against the Defamation Bill despite the three-line whip issued by the party to support the bill.

# US Department of Agriculture steps up engagement in Myanmar

"The opening of the FAS office in Burma is a part of the U.S. commitment to strengthen the partnership between our two countries through increased trade and investment," said FAS Administrator Phil Karsting, who traveled from Washington, D.C., for the official opening on August 8 at the embassy.

# Protect rights of indigenous people: UN agencies

### Dahal likely to expand Cabinet in a day or two

A CPN-Maoist Centre meeting held at Prime Minister Pushpa Kamal Dahal's residence decided that Dahal, who is also the party's chairman, should decide who all to appoint as Cabinet ministers from the party. PM Dahal is preparing to expand the Cabinet by Thursday, according to his Personal Secretary Ramesh Malla. "If the Nepali Congress provides the names by then, the PM will give full shape to the Cabinet and if the NC fails to do so, he will expand the Cabinet by appointing ministers from CPN-MC only by Thursday and will induct NC's ministers in the next expansion," he said.

# Allocation and spending is politically driven in Pakistan, says UNDP
