AFGHANISTAN

U.S. calls government to investigate alleged detention of Ishchi

The U.S. embassy to Kabul on Tuesday welcomes the release of engineer Ahmad Ishchi, urging the government to swiftly investigate his allegations, the unlawful detention and reported mistreatment of Mr. Ishchi by the First Vice President. "We would welcome the Afghan government's move to swiftly investigate these allegations," U.S embassy said in a statement. Meanwhile, The European Union (EU) called for a fair and transparent official investigation into reports of gross human rights violations and abuses against Ahmad Ishchi, the former Jawzjan governor.

Russia must not interfere in our country affairs: senators

Scores of Afghan senators on Tuesday alleged Russia of playing double game with Afghanistan, urging Kremlin to stop interfering into internal affairs of the country. Fazlulhadi Muslimyar chairman of the upper house of parliament criticized Moscow for what he called "clear support to Taliban" and interfering the internal affairs of Afghanistan, asking for the urgent stop.

50 Afghan asylum seekers to be deported from Germany

A group of at least 50 Afghan asylum seekers will be deported from Germany after their applications were rejected by the authorities, it has been reported. Local newspaper, Der Spiegel, citing the government sources, reported Tuesday that the asylum seekers will be deported in line with an agreement reached between the Afghan and German authorities. A spokeswoman for the Ministry of Interior of Germany quoted by Reuters confirmed that there would be a repatriation flight to Afghanistan by the end of the year.

US conduct more airstrikes in East of Afghanistan, 12 ISIS militants killed

The US forces based in Afghanistan conducted at least three more airstrikes against the loyalists of the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) terrorist group, leaving at least 12 of them dead. The local security officials said the airstrikes were conducted using unmanned aerial vehicle in Achin district. The officials further added that the airstrikes were carried out in different times on Tuesday in Mazdaki, Bazar and Gand areas.

BANGLADESH

PM seeks to identify cause, resources of militancy

Delhi agrees to share bulk capital dredging cost

India has agreed to share the bulk cost of capital dredging of the Ashuganj-Zakiganj and Sirajganj-Daikhawa water transit routes in a bid to enhance round-the-year navigability of the protocol routes between the two countries. Bangladesh and India have reached a consensus in this regard during the recent shipping secretary-level meeting between the countries. The nine-member Bangladesh delegation in the meeting was led by Shipping Secretary Ashoke Madhob Roy, while the eleven-member Indian delegation was led by its Shipping Secretary Rajive Kumar.

Bangladeshi delegation to attend Vijay Diwas celebrations in India

A 72-member Bangladeshi delegation led by Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal will attend the Vijay Diwas celebrations in Kolkata to recall the victory in the 1971 Liberation War against Pakistan. The freedom fighters, who participated in the war, have been attending the annual reunion for the past 10 years. "The delegation will comprise of 'Mukti Jodhas' and their families along with serving senior Bangladesh Armed Forces officers," said Major General R Nagraj, MGGS, Headquarters, Eastern Command.

Bangladesh Bank responsible for \$81 million heist: RCBC

The Philippines bank through which \$81 million stolen from Bangladesh's central bank was channeled in February today said that the central bank was responsible for the heist, and so any liability should not be passed on. Manilabased Rizal Commercial Banking Corp (RCBC) was responding to comments by a Bangladeshi investigator that some Bangladesh Bank officials deliberately exposed its computer systems and enabled hackers to steal the money from its account at the Federal Reserve Bank of New York. Bangladesh Bank had been demanding that RCBC compensate it for the loss, blaming it for ignoring red flags.

BHUTAN

Austria extends support of Nu 93M to legal sector

Japan's ANA invests in new airline venture in Myanmar

ANA Holdings Inc. has invested in a new airline venture in Myanmar that aims to start international flights in 2018 as the Japanese carrier seeks to capture demand in Asia's fastest-growing economy, Bloomberg reported on 12 December. ANA has a 49 percent stake and a local company holds the remainder. The companies made a combined initial investment of \$150,000 in the venture, according to the report.
