Besides pledging another \$1billion in development aid, India has signed with Afghanistan three memoranda of understanding (MoUs) on cooperation in areas of prisoners' extradition, judicial system and technology during President Ashraf Ghani's two days visit to New Delhi. President Ghani left for India three days ago and on Wednesday he met with Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi as the two countries signed the three agreements. India pledged \$1billion towards development activity in Afghanistan.

UN Calls for \$150m to Help Internally Displaced Afghans

The UN Under Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief, Stephen O'Brien Friday raised concerns over what he called a rising trend of internally displaced Afghans in the country, calling on the international community to step up efforts to help. The UN official has asked for \$150 USD in aid within four months to facilitate over one million internally displaced Afghans.

US Senator Accuses Pakistan for Being a Duplicitous Partner in Afghanistan

They are supporting the Haqqani network," Senator Bob Corker, Chairman of the powerful Senate Foreign Relations said during a Congressional hearing in Afghanistan.

Afghanistan urges isolation of terror sponsors after attack on Indian base

Afghanistan condemned a deadly attack on the Indian army base in the Indian-administered Kashmir urging to isolate those sponsoring terrorism in the region. "Terrorism is a common threat to the entire region & world; thus, requires joint fight to eliminate terrorists & isolate those who sponsor them," the Afghanistan National Security Council (NSC) said in a statement. The statement further added that "the people of Afghanistan been long victims of terrorism, so we can feel the pain of those who have lost their loved ones in today's attack at Uri."

Asian Development Bank to give BR \$200m

MYANMAR

Myanmar soldiers jailed for killing villagers

Seven Myanmar soldiers have been sentenced to jail for killing villagers during an interrogation, the military said, a rare ruling in the former junta-run country where the army has long operated with impunity. The army controlled Myanmar for half a century in a brutal reign rife with rights abuses, including allegations of torture, rape and recruiting child soldiers.

NEPAL

PM says his India visit successful

Minutes of Karki's appointment safe

The minutes of the Constitutional Council that recommended Lokman Singh Karki as the chief commissioner of the Commission for Investigation for Abuse of Authority are archived in the President's Office, the Prime Minister's Office and other related government entities such as the Ministry of General Administration, informed officials said. With the PMO's response to the Supreme Court that the file related to Karki's appointment was lost in the earthquake last year, the government's archiving system has come under scrutiny. A case concerning Karki's controversial appointment is pending in the apex court, which had sought the related papers.
