War Caused Over 8,000 Civilian Casualties This Year

The United Nations says the war
in Afghan has caused more than
8,000 civilian casualties, including
nearly 2,600 deaths, in the first
nine months of 2016. The U.N.
Assistance Mission in Afghanistan,
UNAMA, while releasing the
casualty toll Wednesday, renewed
its call for all parties to the conflict
to prevent harm to civilians. The
Mission said it has been deeply
concerned by the continuing
increase in child casualties since
2013.

Taliban's mine making factory destroyed in Helmand province

Officials in the 215th Maiwand Corps of the Afghan National Army (ANA) forces said the factory was destroyed during an operation in Nad-e-Ali district.

US Supportive of Afghan Peace Bid, won't Engineer it

The United States is supportive of the Afghan-led peace process and is not looking to engineer it, a State Department official said on Tuesday, but declined detailing its role in the latest talks between Kabul and the Taliban in Qatar. "I'm not going to speak about what our role may or may not be with regard to this new initiative.

As we made clear before, we believe a peace accord is really the primary or the only pathway to ensuring peace and stability in Afghanistan," the State Department deputy spokesman said.

MYANMAR

New Investment Law Enacted

The long-awaited Myanmar Investment Law was signed into being by President U HtinKyaw on Tuesday after both houses approved the bill earlier this month. The local business community is now waiting for State Counsellor Daw Aung San Suu Kyi to reveal the government's more detailed investment policies this coming Saturday. The release of vague policy outlines in late July had failed to satisfy investors and businessmen craving detail and substance.

Suu Kyi conveys 'surgical strike' concerns to Delhi

Aung San Suu Kyi has cautioned the Indian government that she would not accept a repeat of New Delhi's chest-thumping violation of her country's territory last year, 'The Telegraph reported. The Indian newspaper said that the caution came hours after India's junior home minister KirenRijiju publicly revived memories of that surgical strike in a tweet that was later deleted.

DKBA Splinter Group Clashes with Burma Army, Casualties Reported

Casualties were reported in fighting between a splinter group of the Democratic Karen Benevolent Army (DKBA) and a joint force of the Burma Army and the allied Border Guard Force (BGF) on Wednesday in Kawkareik Township of Karen State. "During the attack, four of our soldiers died," Maj Saw San Aung, a leader of the DKBA splinter group—which calls itself the Democratic Karen Buddhist Army—told The Irrawaddy on Thursday. "The fighting lasted over 30 minutes and we heard that one civilian was injured."

NEPAL

Basnyat assigned acting chief of CIAA

Following the suspension of Chief Commissioner of the Commission for the Investigation of Abuse of Authority (CIAA) Lokman Singh Karki, CIAA Commissioner Deep Basnyat has been appointed as the acting chief commissioner of the anti-graft body on Thursday. Karki was suspended after an impeachment motion was registered against him on Wednesday.

Upadhyay stresses on improving trilateral relations

Parties defer House to discuss impeachment informally

Major political parties represented in parliament on Thursday deferred House meet in a bid to forge common stance to move forward the impeachment motion against the chief of the Commission for the Investigation of Abuse of Authority (CIAA), Lokman Singh Karki. The House meeting initially scheduled for 11 am was deferred twice as the largest party in parliament, Nepali Congress (NC), sought time to discuss the issue within the party. The impeachment motion against Karki was on the likely business advisory of Thursday's parliament meeting.

Pakistan lodges protest with India over killing of civilian in cross-border firing

Pakistan, ADB to ink \$250m loan next week

Pakistan and the Asian Development Bank (ADB) will sign a \$250 million loan agreement next week, in a bid to boost cross border trade activities with India and Afghanistan as part of a regional strategic initiative, backed by multilateral institutions and some friendly countries. The loan agreement will be signed on the side-lines of the 15th Ministerial Conference of Central Asia Regional Economic Cooperation (CAREC) that will take place in Islamabad on October 25-26.
