[Myanmar, Bangladesh agree to cooperate on Rohingya refugee repatriation](#)

Myanmar and Bangladesh on Tuesday agreed to cooperate on the repatriation of Rohingya refugees and took steps to boost border security as relations between the neighbours have been strained by the continuing flow of refugees into Bangladesh. Over 600,000 Rohingya Muslims have fled Myanmar since Aug. 25, when Rohingya insurgent attacks sparked a ferocious military response by the Myanmar army that the United Nations has called ethnic cleansing.

Issues related to connectivity were discussed between the two in detail. The establishment of an air freight corridor was acknowledged as an important factor in providing Afghan farmers direct and easy access to the Indian market.

BANGLADESH

[Bangladeshi scientists discover fast, cheap way to detect cancer](#)

A team led by an expatriate Bangladeshi scientist in Australia has developed a simple, fast, and inexpensive way to detect cancers at an early stage. Muhammad Jahirul Alam Shiddiky, who led the research team, teaches in the Griffith University as a senior lecturer. Anyone can diagnose cancer at home using this method, Jahirul told Prothom Alo. One has to take one or two drops of blood, serum or urine from cancer patients. Then a tiny amount of organic indicator (biomarker) that changes colour if the test is positive is added and a naked-eye observation can be used to find out the presence of cancer, said Jahirul.

[Bangladesh financial market needs credible benchmark](#)

Bangladesh's financial market runs sans effective benchmark called 'Dhaka Interbank Offered Rate (DIBOR)', leaving parties to quote rates in contracts and other financial instruments impromptu. Such ratings without a formal reference rate for the financial market are not always acceptable to foreign parties, and local stakeholders also get into difficulties in financial dealings, sources said. Though DIBOR initiative was launched at least eight years back, it remained a forgotten name as it couldn't make any headway in terms of its acceptance and popularizing.

Under the framework for Continued Bhutanese-Danish Partnership, the Foreign Ministry has coordinated with relevant agencies and formulated potential project proposals in the areas of organic agriculture, digitalisation, cultural exchanges, and climate change. This was highlighted by the Foreign Ministry officials during the 2nd high level biennial consultation between Bhutan and Denmark governments in the capital yesterday. However, Bhutanese officials mentioned that priority has been given to organic agriculture sector. “We have prioritised cooperation in organic agriculture not only because Denmark is the world’s leading organic nation but also keeping in mind how organic agriculture can accelerate the conservation of the our environment,” said Kesang Wangdi, Director General of Foreign Ministry’s Department of Bilateral Affairs.

[Budget of MVR 26 million for Parliament by-elections](#)

The Parliament has passed a budget of MVR 26 million to hold the by-elections for the vacated seats at the parliament. Elections Commission has declared six constituencies as vacant. They are those of the MP for Villingili constituency, Saud Hussain, MP for Thulusdhoo constituency, Mohamed Waheed Ibrahim (Lawyer Wadde), MP for Maduvvari constituency, Mohamed Ameeth, MP for Dhiddhoo constituency Abdul Latheef Mohamed and the MP for South Mahchangolhi constituency, Abdulla Shinan and the MP for Dhangethi constituency, Il’ham Ahmed. Minister of Finance and Treasury, Ahmed Munawar proposed a supplementary budget of MVR 493 million to the parliament today.

MYANMAR

[Myanmar and Bangladesh reach 10-point agreement on refugees](#)

Myanmar and Bangladesh reached a 10-point agreement on Rohingya refugees at a meeting held yesterday in Naypyitaw and attended by representatives of the Home Ministries of the two countries. The agreement includes, “Stopping immediately entry by Myanmar nationals into Bangladesh and repatriation of refugees at the earliest date and restoring normalcy in Rakhine Region for their resettlement.” Both sides also agreed to form a joint working committee this coming November to arrange resettlement. The UN said that over 600,000 refugees had fled Myanmar after the Tatmadaw (armed forces) retaliated against ARSA terrorists group which launched coordinated attacks against some police outposts in northern Rakhine Region at the end of August.

[Myanmar to reap greater rewards in deep-sea port development project](#)

Myanmar is set to receive a greater amount of the profit-sharing in a \$7.2 billion deep-sea port development project in the town of Kyaukphyu in western Rakhine state, though negotiations with the main Chinese investor are ongoing, RFA reported on 24 October quoting a commerce ministry official. A consortium led by CITIC Group Corporation Ltd., China's state-owned investment company, is negotiating the profit-sharing deal with Myanmar officials for the deep-sea port, which is part of two development initiatives that also include an industrial park for a special economic zone and residential condominiums on 4,200 acres of land in Kyaukphyu, Ramree, and Manaung townships. The Myanmar government awarded CITIC the tenders for both projects in 2015.

NEPAL

[Poll duty to deprive lakhs of right to vote](#)

EC says it didn't have time to issue voter ids to govt staff on poll duty. Over half a million civil servants, teachers, security personnel, judges and other government employees deployed on election duty will not be able to cast their votes in the provincial and parliamentary elections slated for November 26 and December 7. In the first and second Constituent Assembly elections, government employees deployed on poll duty had the chance to vote under proportional representation electoral system, as the EC had issued them temporary voter identity cards and had also set up temporary polling centres for them. The EC said due to time constraint they could not arrange temporary voter identity cards or set up temporary polling centres for government employees deployed on poll duty, said EC Information Officer Surya Prasad Aryal.
