<u>Trilateral Dialogue to Foster Peace</u> <u>and Stability</u>

Khaama Press/Pajhwok | 29th May Afghanistan, China and Pakistan have held their first round of trilateral Practical Cooperation Dialogue (PCD) in Beijing, the capital of China, a media report said on Sunday. The three countries agreed to promote practical measures for cooperation and exchanged views on deeper trilateral links during the meeting late on Saturday, according to Pakistani newspaper The Express Tribune. The dialogue was co-chaired by Director General (DG) Mansoor Ahmad Khan from Pakistan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, his Chinese counterpart Xiao Qian and Director General Khalid Payenda from the Afghan Ministry of Finance.The three sides noted that trilateral cooperation among was conducive to peace, stability and development of Afghanistan and the region. They appreciated the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor and its benefits for promoting regional connectivity.

Sri Lanka flood rescue efforts continue as death toll rises to 164 Colombo Page | 29th May Sri Lanka's rescue efforts continued Monday as the death toll from the devastating floods and rose to 164 with 104 people are still missing. In its latest situation report the Disaster Management Center on Monday said 471,542 people belonging to 128,586 families were affected in 15 Districts due to the flood situation while 75,236 people belonging to 18,652 families were located at 336 safe locations.

AFGHANISTAN

ISIS militants among 50 killed in joint operations of Afghan forces: MoD

At least fifty insurgents including four loyalists of the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) terrorist group were killed during the joint operations of the Afghan National Defense and Security Forces (ANDSF) personnel, the Ministry of Defense (MoD) said Sunday. According to a statement by MoD, at least 21 insurgents were also wounded during the operations. The statement further added at least 16 of the insurgents were killed during the operations conducted in the outskirts of Tarinkot city, the provincial capital of Uruzgan province and at least three others were wounded while 2 of their hideouts were destroyed.

Terrorists Hiding, Collecting Money in Pakistan: Ghani

President Ashraf Ghani says he is still awaiting the implementation of the commitments Pakistan made five months ago to help end the conflict in the country. In an interview with a Pan-Arab daily, Ghani alleged many terrorists were hiding in Pakistan and collecting funds there, but concrete action against the extremists was yet to be taken. He told Asharq al-Awsat newspaper over a million Afghani citizens had started returning to their country from Pakistan and Iran. The Afghans were driving al-Qaeda and ISIS fighters from their areas, he added. About the Arab-Islamic-US summit, the president said it was the first major step towards regaining the glory of Islam as an international civilisation based on science, peace and tolerance.

'Over 140,000 refugees return home from neighboring countries'

Ministry of Refugees and Repatriation on Sunday said that over 140,000 Afghan refugees returned home mostly from Pakistan and Iran in the past two months. "Some 89,299 refugees from Iran and 55,694 refugees from Pakistan returned home since be gaining of solar year," said SayedHussainAlemiBalkhi, refugees minister. He said that over 1,300 Afghan refugees returned to the country from European states, where out this figure 987 were returned voluntarily and 329 were deported. In the year of 2016, Afghan refugees deported from Europe were 580 Afghans, he added.

Secession fears cloud Myanmar peace talks: government

government of Aung San Suu Kyi has made striking a peace deal a key pillar of her administration, but fighting has instead intensified in recent months, with tens of thousands displaced by conflict.

China-backed militia new powerbrokers in Myanmar peace process

Foundation stone laid for Ktm-Tarai expressway

EC gears up for second phase of local elections

PAKISTAN

Pakistan draws redlines for joining Saudi alliance

Pakistan has decided to draw certain 'redlines' for becoming part of the Saudi-led Islamic Military Alliance against Terrorism (IMAT) in an effort to avoid the negative fallout of its participation in the initiative that has potential to undermine ties with neighbouring Iran.It was thought that the government had already joined the alliance when in April it granted permission to former army chief General (retd) Raheel Sharif to lead the 41-nation counterterrorism alliance. Officials, however, clarified that the final decision had not yet been taken. What compelled

Pakistan to have a second thought was the recent Arab Islamic-US summit in Riyadh where statements from Saudi authorities suggested that the alliance was meant to counter Iran as well as fighting terrorism.

Pakistan's economic growth still hindered

Pakistan faces a barricade on the highway to faster progress. And the identification of this barricade is possible only through the indicators that are relevant. In this context, the most relevant is the growth in Gross Domestic Product (GDP), along with increment in exports as well as investment in key sectors. Over the past decade, Pakistan never seemed to take off in the export and investment sectors. Thereby, GDP growth was restricted to below 5%. That is a discouraging situation for an economy that has all the potential to have GDP at minimum 7%, export growth at nearly 15% and investment in the engineering, production and marketing sectors at minimum 20%.

Nawaz bars PML-N MPs from going abroad

The prime minister is learnt to have barred PML-N lawmakers from going abroad, ensuring the adoption of the Finance Bill. Sources cited strict orders, requiring lawmakers to seek prior permission from the party's top leadership in case there was any 'grave urgency' for foreign travel, the sources said. Ensuring the maximum presence of the ruling party lawmakers in the National Assembly during the current budget session is seen as an attempt to counter tough opposition in the lower house.

Pakistan fears Indian influence in Afghanistan, say US spy chiefs

The US intelligence community, in a rare acknowledgement of Pakistan's concerns, has informed Congress that Islamabad does not want heavy Indian influence in Afghanistan and will likely turn to China to offset New Delhi's sway on its western borders. The discussion on Pakistan's interests in Afghanistan was part of a recent congressional hearing on the Afghan war and is linked to a general debate in Washington on the issue. The Trump administration is finalising a new policy for Afghanistan and the ongoing consultations in the White House have generated much interest in the US media and think tanks.

SRI LANKA

Cyclonic storm 'Mora' brings more rain and strong winds

The depression in the East-central Bay of Bengal has intensified into cyclonic storm 'Mora' but is moving away from the island. Under it's influence cloudy skies, windy and showery conditions are expected over the country, the Department of Meteorology said. Strong winds of around 80 kmph can be expected over the country (These wind conditions are especially expected over the western slope of the central hills) and surrounding sea areas.

China to provide US\$ 2.2 million worth emergency disaster relief goods to Sri Lanka

The Chinese government today announced that it will donate emergency humanitarian disaster relief goods worth a total amount of RMB 15 million (about 2.2 million US dollars) to Sri Lankan people who were affected by floods and landslides.
