Dhaka attack: 20 hostages killed Friday night, says ISPR

The Daily Star | 2nd July Gunmen killed 20 people, mostly with sharp weapons, shortly after taking hostage a number of diners at a café in Dhaka's diplomatic zone last evening, according to Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR). As per instruction by the honourable head of the government, Bangladesh Army conducted Operation Thunderbolt, Brig Gen Nayeem Ashfaque Chowdhury, director of military operations, told journalists at a press briefing this afternoon. Joint security force led by army recovered 20 bodies during a search on the compound of the Spanish restaurant, Holey Artisan Bakery after the operation was launched, Brig Gen Nayeem said.

<u>Pakistan overtakes India in money</u> stashed in Swiss banks

A new report released by the Swiss National Bank on Thursday states that the total funds linked to Pakistan in Swiss banks stood at CHF 1,513 million at the end of 2015, up nearly 16 per cent from CHF 1,301 billion a year ago.

AFGHANISTAN

Taliban's Eid attack plot foiled in Balkh, bomb making factory busted

A bomb making factory of the Taliban group was busted during an operation in northern Balkh province of Afghanistan, by the Afghan intelligence on Sunday. The National Directorate of Security (NDS) said the factory was discovered in Robat village located in Chemtal district. According to a statement by NDS, two experts working in the factory to manufacture Improvised Explosive Device (IED) were also detained during the operation.

Top security officials investigated for deadly Kabul attack

Top Afghan security officials in the Ministry of Interior were investigated for a deadly attack in capital Kabul that targeted a

convoy of the Afghan police cadets. Sources in the Ministry of Interior (MoI) have said at least 10 senior officials have been investigated, apparently for any negligence that led to the death of at least 33 police cadets. The incident in Kabul took place on Thursday after a suicide bomber targeted the convoy of the vehicle and second blast took place minutes after the first explosion.

Pakistan, US Agree to Push for Afghan Reconciliation

Pakistan and the United States, despite a mismatch of perceptions on drone strikes, have agreed on continued cooperation on the issue of peace and reconciliation in Afghanistan. US Special Representative Ambassador Richard Olson and Foreign Secretary Aizaz Chaudhry reached the agreement at a meeting in Islamabad late on Saturday. US-Pakistan relations soured after a May drone strike in Balochistan killed Afghan Taliban chief Mullah Akhtar Mansour and congressional calls stronger action against the Hagqani network.

Kabul to Win Long-Term Pledges At Warsaw Summit: CEO

Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Abdullah Abdullah on Sunday said Afghanistan would go to NATO summit in Poland's capital Warsaw next week with full preparations in areas of defence and security. Abdullah expressed these views during a meeting with NATO senior civilian representative Ismail Aramaz at his office in Kabul, a statement from the CEO office said. The statement said Abdullah and Aramaz discussed next week's heads of states summit of the alliance in Warsaw and Afghanistan's preparations for the July 8-9 gathering.

BANGLADESH

PM Hasina to join ceremony for paying homage to victims of Dhaka cafe terror attack

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will pay her respects to the victims of the terror attack at a Gulshan cafe in a ceremony on Monday. Press Secretary to the PM Ihsanul Karim told bdnews24.com that the ceremony will be held at the Army Stadium and the prime minister will pay homage at 10am. The homage ceremony between 10am and 12pm will be open for all, he said. The Awami League said in a statement that its central leaders will also pay respect on Monday.

Khaleda for unity against terrorism

"Let's build a peaceful, democratic and safe Bangladesh, forgetting all divisions among us. "It's no longer a big issue as to who will be in power. Now the present and the future of this country are at stake. No achievement is going to last if we can't resist terrorism and ensure safety of people's lives," Khaleda said at a press briefing at her Gulshan office in the capital after a meeting of her party's standing committee members.
