Nepal, US to sign \$500m grant pact on Sept 14

Nepal will sign an agreement with the US government on September 14 to secure a grant of \$500 million (approximately Rs51.5 billion) for construction of transmission lines and maintenance of various road sections. A Nepali delegation is planning to leave for the US on September 12 to seal the deal. Khaama Press | 3rd September Pakistan's foreign minister Khawajah Asif on Saturday reacted at President Ghani's remarks regarding Kabul's readiness to hold peace talks with Pakistan. Asif told reporters "Pakistan's position on Afghanistan is very clear: we want to see peace and stability in the country." Insisting that Pakistan will contribute and play its due role in all the initiatives taken to peace in Afghanistan, Asif said "We already have bilateral, trilateral, quadrilateral and multilateral mechanisms for dialogue and interaction with Afghanistan in place."

AFGHANISTAN

Afghans Impregnable on Sectarian Lines: Ghani Outlook Afghanistan/Pajhwok | 4th September President Ashraf Ghani during a meeting with Sunni and Shiite scholars has urged them to expose real intention of terrorists in their sermons and promote religious harmony. The president, who met the religious scholars at the Presidential Palace on Friday afternoon, once again expressed his grief over the terrorist attack on the Imam Zaman mosque in Kabul. "We don't want the war which is imposed on us, but the Afghanistan enemies should know they are isolated," said the president, who confirmed conspiracies at fueling sectarian violence in the country.

US Defense Secretary Orders New Troop Deployment to Afghanistan

US Defense Secretary James Mattis has said that he has signed deployment orders to send more troops to Afghanistan, days after President Donald Trump announced a new strategy to prolong war in the strategically important country located within South Asia and Central Asia, APA reports quoting Press TV. "Yes, I've signed orders, but it's not complete. In other words, I've signed some of the [orders for] troops that will go and we are identifying the specific ones," Mattis told reporters at the Pentagon on Thursday. The Pentagon chief did not say how many troops would be dispatched as part of the deployment orders. "By and large this is to enable the Afghan forces to fight more effectively. It's more advisers, it's more enablers. Fire support, for example, and there's some other things," Mattis said.

Govt. to Spend \$6bn on Afghan Air Force: Ghani

President Ghani said during a visit to Nangarhar that the Afghan Air Force will be boosted by government in order to increase capability. President Ashraf Ghani said on Sunday during a visit to eastern Nangarhar province that government will spend \$6 billion USD on the air force in the next four years. In Nangarhar to review the province's security situation, Ghani said: "The air force's capability will be increased." Ghani also visited the military hospital at the 201 Military Corps in the province and met with a number of officials in Nangarhar. "We are ready for both war and peace. In four years we will spend \$6 billion on the country's air force," Ghani said.

BANGLADESH

Turkey's Erdogan phones Bangladesh President Hamid, talks Rohingya issue

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has called up his Bangladesh counterpart Md Abdul Hamid over the current state of the Rohingya crisis. The foreign ministry said on Friday that the Turkish president supported measures taken by Bangladesh over the Rohingya refugee issue in the conversation on Thursday night. Erdogan expressed concern over the ongoing violence in Myanmar's Rakhine state while Hamid informed him about the steps taken by Bangladesh. The Turkish president assured Hamid of full support and cooperation in Bangladesh's bid to send back the Rohingya refugees to Myanmar. He also assured the Bangladesh president of raising the issue at different international fora, according to a media release from the foreign ministry.

Myanmar building economic zone in Rakhine to boost trade with Bangladesh

The Myanmar authorities have said the construction of an economic zone on the outskirts of Maungdaw Township in northern Rakhine state is expected to start when the 'current situation in the area calms down'. A regional minister told the Myanmar Times that the zone is dedicated to promoting trade, manufacturing and services and it would also benefit 'local residents' in the area with the jobs created by the project. "When the economic zone is

completed, it will be much more convenient. It will create jobs and result in more development. It can reduce conflict," State Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economics and Planning U Kyaw Aye Thein added. "The first phase of the zone will emphasise trade with Bangladesh, while subsequent development will expand into the manufacturing, financial and services sectors, including banks, factories and other industries in the area," he said.

BHUTAN

Traders should not consider GST benefit as profit

Importers, suppliers, distributors, dealers, wholesalers, and retailers gaining from the Indian goods and services tax (GST) should not con-sider the benefit as profit. The benefits, officiating secretary of economic affairs ministry, Sonam P Wangdi, said should be passed down to the consumers and that the office of consumer protection would ensure that prices are not distorted. A notification was also issued on August 28 to this effect. About 81 percent of goods and services in India fall below or in the 18 percent tax band and the rest falls under 28 percent tax band. However, for Bhutan GST will not be imposed as the Indian GST law specifies that exports from India to any country will be zero-rated, meaning that goods of Indian origin will be cheaper in Bhutan.

Climate change and TB in WHO's regional meeting agenda

Health minister of 11 member countries will attend the 70th Regional Committee meeting of World Health Organisation South-East Asia Region (WHO SEAR) region in the Maldives from September 6 to 10. WHO Goodwill Ambassador for Hepatitis in South-East Asia Region, Amitabh Bachchan, will join the meeting to advocate for urgent action against viral hepatitis, a preventable disease that kills approximately 410,000 people in the region every year, a press release from WHO SEAR office states.

Maldives cease all trade ties with Myanmar

The Maldivian government has condemned the atrocities being committed against the Rohingya Muslims in Myanmar and ceased all trade ties with the country. A statement issued by the Foreign Ministry today said that the Maldives is "deeply concerned by the recent cycle of violence that resulted the death of dozens of Rohingya Muslims and displacing several thousands."

MYANMAR

<u>Increased connectivity and trade sought in India-Myanmar relations</u>

Chinese experts skeptical of Nepal's commitment to BRI

PAKISTAN

Will face courts in Benazir murder case: Musharraf
