Durand is a redline for Afghanistan: Afghan govt is ready to defend the country sovereignty, if Pak continue violation along Durand line Afghanistan Times | 6th April Ministry of Foreign Affairs on Wednesday condemned Pakistan violations along de-facto Durand Line as a 'unilateral and illogical move. It said that security and defense forces of Afghanistan are ready to defend the country's sovereignty, if Pakistan action continue along de-facto Durand line. " if Pakistan violation continue along the de-facto Durand line, the government of Afghanistan and security forces are ready to defend the country's integrity and national sovereignty," Said Spokesman of Ministry of Foreign Affairs Ahmad ShekibMustaghni. He said that the government of Afghanistan will refer the issue to the nation and do whatever the Afghan nation prefer.

"Certainly, defence cooperation would be one of the outcomes of the visit," Indian foreign secretary Subrahmanyam Jaishankar told a visiting Bangladesh media delegation at the Ministry of External Affairs in New Delhi on Thursday evening.

Pakistan ready for talks with India on terrorism: Foreign Office Dawn|7thApril The Foreign Office said on Thursday that Pakistan was ready for dialogue with India on terrorism and would like to discuss Indian role in subversive activities in Pakistani territory."India wants to speak of terrorism! We also insist on speaking of terrorism ... We need to address Indiansponsored terrorism in Pakistan," FO spokesman NafeesZakaria said at the weekly media briefing. He was commenting on the Indian reaction to a statement by US Ambassador to UN Nikki Haley in which she had indicated US interest in mediating between India and Pakistan to prevent the tensions between the South Asian rivals from escalating.

AFGHANISTAN

25 militants killed, vehicle packed with explosives destroyed in Uruzgan airstrike

At least twenty insurgents were killed and a vehicle packed with explosives was destroyed in an airstrike conducted in southern Uruzgan province of Afghanistan. The Ministry of Defense (MoD) said the airstrike was conducted in the vicinity of Tarinkot city, the provincial capital of Uruzgan province. Uruzgan is among the relatively volatile provinces in southern Afghanistan where the Taliban insurgents and militants belonging to the other insurgent groups are actively operating in its various districts.

NATO pledges \$2.7 million for Kabul military hospital reconstruction

The NATO-led Resolute Support Mission in Afghanistan has pledged \$2.7 million for the main military hospital in

Kabul which has witnessed a deadly attack last month. A spokesman for the Resolute Mission Capt Bill Salvin told reporters in Kabul today that the repair work of Sardar Mohammad Daud Khan hospital has been completed by 90 per cent after the attack by the insurgents. He said the NATO-led Resolute Support Mission is budgeted \$2.7 million which will include \$1.7 million for new medical equipment and \$1 million for new furnishings.

Trump and Merkel pledge close cooperation on Afghanistan and Ukraine

The US President Donald Trump and the German Chancellor Angela Merkel have pledged close cooperation on conflict in Ukraine and the situation in Afghanistan. The White House in a statement said "President Donald J. Trump spoke today by telephone with Chancellor Angela Merkel of Germany." The statement further added that the leaders discussed several issues of mutual concern and interest, including the conflict in eastern Ukraine and the situation in Afghanistan. The leaders pledged close cooperation and coordination on these and other issues," the statement said, adding that "They agreed to remain in close contact."

Key Topic at next OIC Meeting in Saudi to be on Afghan War Outlook Afghanistan/ Tolonews | 6th April The Chief Executive Abdullah Abdullah's office on Wednesday said Afghanistan is ready for the next Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) meeting that will be held in Saudi Arabia to discuss Afghanistan's war. The CEO's office also said that focus will be paid to the issue that the war should not be fought under the name of Islam. The CEO's deputy spokesman Jawed Faisal said all preparations have been made for the conference where religious scholars are expected to issue a fatwa against the ongoing war.

Terror & Extremism have no Link to Islam: IIUI President

Officials of the International Islamic University in Islamabad (IIUI) say the twin scourge of terrorism and extremism has no link to Islam, a religion that sets great store by peace and brotherhood. During a meeting with a delegation of Afghan journalists currently visiting Pakistan, IIUI President Prof. Dr. Ahmed Yousif Ahmed Al Draiweesh said terrorism had no religion. In addition to Afghanistan and Pakistan, terrorist attacks were happening in Saudi Arabia too, he added.

Afghan Taliban are strategic asset of Pakistan

The former US special representative for Afghanistan and Pakistan, Richard Olson has said that Pakistan still allows Afghan Taliban to use its soil as its 'core strategic asset' and is unlikely to abandon the terrorist groups as its Afghan policy is about "geo-strategic maneuvering" against India and following strategic depth in Afghanistan. Olson has said that he was convinced that Pakistan would not shun the safe sanctuaries for Afghan Taliban, roaming freely there and using its territory against Afghanistan.

BANGLADESH

New Delhi sees opportunities in Sheikh Hasina's visit, no Teesta surprise on the horizon

New Delhi sees Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's visit as an "opportunity" to raise Bangladesh-India relations to a new level, though there is no indication so far of the Teesta water sharing issue getting resolved during the Bangladesh leader's state visit beginning on Friday. "I don't want to mislead you. My honest assessment is that I don't have anything right now which makes me believe that something dramatic will happen in the next two days," Indian Foreign Secretary S Jaishankar said during his interaction with a group of Bangladesh journalists on Thursday.

India's financial aid to Banglades, Afghanistan, Sri Lanka dips

India's development assistance to war-ravaged Afghanistan has seen a reduction of nearly Rs 6.60 billion in 2016-17 compared to the year-ago period while its financial grant to Bangladesh and Sri Lanka were also slashed significantly. According to data presented to the Lok Sabha by Minister of State External Affairs V K Singh, India

provided development aid of Rs 2.21 billion to Afghanistan between April 1, 2016 and March 27, 2017 as against Rs 8.80 billion in 2015-16 and Rs 7.23 billion in 2014-15.

Bangladesh, Myanmar agrees to remove land mines from border

Bangladesh and Myanmar agreed to remove improvised explosive devices (IEDs) and land mines along the border of the two countries, said BGB's Additional Director General Anisur Rahman to reporters. "After detailed discussions, we've agreed to take necessary steps for removing improvised explosive devices and land mines from the border areas for smooth border management, including carrying out patrol", he said.

Bangladesh economy to grow by 6.9pc FY 2017, 2018, says ADB report

Bangladesh's economy recorded a robust growth in FY2016 on the back of higher private sector investment and exports despite declining remittance inflow, says the Asian Development Bank (ADB). In its annual publication the 'Asian Development Outlook 2017', the global lender projects Bangladesh to grow by a moderate 6.9 per cent in FY 2017 and expects it to remain unchanged in the next fiscal, reports bdnews24.com.

India offers support to develop rly network

Indian Minister of Railways Suresh Prabhu has said that his country is ready to help Bangladesh in a greater way to modernise its railway network and expand it accordingly if it benefits Bangladesh, reports UNB. "We don't want to do anything which doesn't benefit Bangladesh, too. Both sides must benefit from any such cooperation," Suresh Prabhu was quoted by the news agency as saying while talking to a visiting Bangladesh media delegation at Rail Bhaban in New Delhi on Wednesday.

Education ministry takes action against Tendu school authority

Two former presidents calls for Qasim's release

China's trans-Myanmar pipeline to start pumping oil in May

A pipeline pumping crude oil from Myanmar's Rakhine coastline into Yunnan Province in China will finally be operational in May after several delays, according to the Thura Swiss market research company based in Yangon. An official from investors Southeast Asia Crude Oil Pipeline (SEAOP) was cited in local and Chinese media reports this week saying that the pipeline is ready for operation, and that commencement is awaiting "instructions from higher ups."

Economic ties, border issues on agenda in Beijing for President Htin Kyaw

Economic cooperation and border management will be high on the Myanmar president's agenda as he makes his first visit to China amid an economic slowdown at home and increased fighting with armed ethnic groups, Chinese analysts said. The visit is aimed at enhancing mutual understanding and promoting friendly relations and cooperation between Myanmar and China, according to the Xinhua News Agency.

NEPAL

Third EPG meeting: Indian side positive on Nepal's proposal to revise peace treaty

PAKISTAN

Germany announces €109 million for Pakistan

Germany announced a financial package of €109 million for Pakistan in order to develop economic ties between the two countries. The Declaration of Intent, which was signed following a meeting between Finance Minister Ishaq Dar and German Federal Minister for Economic Cooperation and Development DrGerd Muller on Thursday, promises €109 million to Pakistan in the next two years.

Afghanistan takes up Pakistan's border fencing with UN

Afghanistan has complained to the UN Security Council about Pakistan's 'violations' along the border, the Afghan Foreign Ministry has said. Spokesman Ahmad ShakeebMustaghni told a news conference in Kabul that his government has shared 'evidence' with the United Nations about Pakistan's activities on the border and asked it to take a decision. He argued that Pakistan "cannot fence the border without Afghanistan's consent" and any unilateral action would be a 'violation' of international laws. On its part, Pakistan insists that fencing and other measures are aimed at checking cross-border movement of militants, blamed for violence in both the countries.

Last week, Army chief General QamarJaved Bajwa had announced that fencing has started in Bajaur and Mohmand tribal regions.

Sindh lends 23,000 cusecs water to Balochistan

Despite having differences over share of water, Sindh – for the first time in the history of Pakistan – has lent 23,000 cusecs of water from its share to Balochistan to avoid an expected shortfall of drinking water in the province. On the other hand, the Indus River System Authority (Irsa) has increased – with an immediate effect – water share of Sindh from 40,000 cusecs to 45,000 cusecs as per its demand submitted on Thursday.

Changes in White House to increase pressure on Pakistan: experts

This week's shake-up in the Trump White House could also lead to greater pressure on Pakistan to create a condition that allows the United States to win the war in Afghanistan, US experts say. The experts, who spoke to Dawn, said that there's still no talk in the US capital of severing ties with this key nation. But the new South Asian desk in the White House National Security will now be headed by a person who wants Pakistan to align its policies on terrorism and Afghanistan with those of the United States.

SRI LANKA

European Union pledges Euro 42 million to Sri Lanka

The European Union (EU) will step up its assistance to Sri Lanka, by providing Euro 42 million (approximately LKR 6.93 billion) for the implementation of two programmes: Support to the Modernisation of the Agricultural Sector in Sri Lanka (EUR 30 million) and Strengthening Reconciliation Processes in Sri Lanka (EUR 12 million). Secretary to the Ministry of Finance, Dr. R. H. S. Samaratunge signed the agreements on behalf of the Government in the presence of Ambassador to Sri Lanka and the Maldives for the Delegation of the European Union, H.E. Tung Lai Margue.

Sri Lanka's President underscores the need for a more efficient and systematic tax system for strong national economy
