THE ASPEN SEMINAR: INDIA LEADERSHIP INITIATIVE CLASS 3

The Aspen Seminar was first developed in the 1950s with the purpose of fostering discussion on the concept of the 'good society'. Questions which arise in the process are: What is a good society? What values should prevail? What role can one as a leader play in making it a reality?

The notion of the 'good society' is not immediately easy to grasp. Fortunately, humankind has been discussing it for millennia. To help with this quest, senior moderators Peter Reiling and Keith Berwick of the Aspen Institute USA, invited the participants to what Aspen calls 'The Great Conversation' — a conversation that spans the ages as well as the globe — with writers such as Aristotle, Hobbes, Rousseau, Sumner, Marx, Popper and Simone de Beauvoir. Also included were extracts from Plato's *The Republic*, Arthur Okun's *Equality and Efficiency: The Big Trade Off*, Gandhi and Tolstoy's *Letter to a Hindu*. Each reading formed a

springboard for discussion of a different aspect of the 'good society.'

The ILI: 3 fellows thereafter engaged in a passionate dialogue around the inevitable tensions that arise in defining and building the 'good society.' The moderators helped the group to tease out

meanings from the timeless texts and apply them to modern day life and challenges faced by each one of them as leaders. The different readings came together in the 'Four Poles of the Good Society' by James O'Toole in his book *The Executive Compass*.

Great fluctuations in the international financial system leading to financial crises have become a common phenomenon in the last two decades. This can be attributed to the changes in finance brought about by increasing interdependence, internationalization and integration. This has the unintended consequence that failures and lack of growth can significantly impact not only individual economies but also markets, financial intermediaries, and economies around the world. In the immediate aftermath of the recent financial crisis, there is a need for a

new paradigm and way of doing things. Dr. Rakesh Mohan's book *Growth with Financial Stability* talks about this need.
