Neera Nundy's (Class 3) Dasra ties up with leading philanthropists to launch

India's first exclusive family philanthropy network



Leading philanthropists in India and Dasra have come together to launch GivingPi - India's first and exclusive family philanthropy network. This invite-only network is focused on growing the ecosystem of family philanthropy for a transformed India, where a billion thrive with dignity and equity.

By 2030, GivingPi aims to have 5,000 members, annually giving \$1 billion to diverse social causes in India. The network is committed to creating a vibrant community of family givers by supporting them on their giving journey, nurturing collaboration and growing family philanthropy, for a developed India.

Bajaj Fellow Neera Nundy, co-founder, Dasra, said: "Families are powerful constructs for driving social change, but their giving gets overshadowed by CSR. Family philanthropy has tremendous potential that once unleashed can be transformative for India's development."

Pranshu Singhal (Class 7) conferred the Social Entrepreneur of the Year Award by Schwab Foundation



Pranshu was given the award at the World Economic Forum '22, held in Davos-Klosters, Switzerland. He was recognised for his promising entrepreneurial journey to scale up high-impact models and catalyse a circular economy in India.

Pranshu set up 'Karo Sambhav' (Make It Possible) in 2017, to make circular economy a reality. Starting with electronic waste, Karo Sambhav has since expanded its scope to other waste streams such as glass, plastics and batteries. Pranshu and his team have been instrumental in setting up a well governed, bottom-up collection system by partnering with businesses, civil societies, international societies and the informal sector.

At Davos, Pranshu addressed the session on 'Transforming through Trust' and urged businesses to participate in creating the other half of the economy in a fair and transparent manner. He believes "People will queue up for participation if they are provided with a solution, if they are given the ability to participate".

The Digital Defenders Network (DDN) in India seeks to protect journalists, activists and other citizens that are being arrested for speaking online. DDN is envisioned as a pan-Indian digital network of lawyers, academics, and policy experts in technology, software, data privacy and data protection. These 'Digital Defenders' believe that truly significant reform in the digital sphere can be achieved by hastening collaboration and building strong professional networks of lawyers throughout India.
